"My oil pastel paintings reflect shapes and forms in nature. The soft-edged fluency invites the viewer to inject his or her own feelings (or experiences) into the scene. Visualization is a healing tool. My work allows the mind to escape from realities and discover new possibilities. These "referenced" landscapes capture the essence of a place or a moment in time....a paint box sky at sunset or mysteries of fog-engulfed vistas. I replay the memory of events and bring them to life again on paper. I have used oil pastel with solvent wash to create soft effects.
